Authors whose abstracts have been selected will be notified by 31 December 2018. Papers are due no later than 1 March 2019 and will be pre-circulated. Papers should not yet be published.

Each paper will be assigned a commentator, who will introduce the paper followed by a discussion with workshop participants. The workshop will be conducted on the assumption that everyone has read all of the papers in advance. Attendance will be open to all.

The workshop is kindly hosted by Seton Hall Law School in Newark, NJ, about 25 minutes by public transport from New York's Penn Station. It is co-sponsored by the ABILA United Nations Law Committee and the ILA's Study Group on UN Sanctions and International Law, which will hold a business meeting on the same day.
